TACOMA TITAN TALKERS GARNER EIGHT TROPHIES

The TCC Forensics Team placed second in the State Community College Forensics Tournament held April 15 and 16 at Grays Harbor Community College.

They also picked up eight trophies.

Individuals representing TCC were: Richard Amsden, Janice Brevik, Chris Czarnecki, Renwick Jones, Jon Wesley and Betty Wight. The team was coached and instructed by Mary Gates.

In Sweepstakes points (computed on the basis of number of finalists and numbers of individuals placing) Tacoma came in a close second with 72 points. Everett Community College was first with 78.5 points and Lower Columbia was third with 59 points.

The debate team of Richard Amsden and Chris Czarnecki took second place in the tournament losing to the Lower Columbia College team which had just returned from the national community college tournament in Washington, D.C. The

Two finalists in impromptu speaking were Richard Amsden and Chris Czarnecki: Miss Czarnecki placed third in that event. Double finaling and double trophying occurred in expository speaking where both second and third place in the state were retained by TCC squad members--Richard Amsden second place and Chris Czarnecki third place.

Other entries for Tacoma included the dual interpretation team of Janice Brevik and Betty Wight which received a rating of excellent; Janice Brevik in interpretation with an excellent rating as well as an excellent rating in expository speaking; and Betty Wight with an excellent rating in expository speaking.
