The contest is sponsored by the District Two and Three Western Washington Music Educators and is organized by Dave Whisner, chairman of the TCC music department.

High schools sending bands to compete include: Vashon Island, Lindbergh, White River, Central Kitsap, Mount Tahoma, Tahoma, Hazen, Auburn, Stadium (two bands), Foster, Foster (Seattle), Peninsula (two bands), Fife, West High (Bremerton) and Enumclaw (two bands).

The public is invited to attend. Each band is scheduled to play for twenty minutes.

Thursday, April 26, Eileen Soule, University of Puget Sound professor of Biology will be presenting a talk and slides about the octopus and its habitat.

Both sessions will be held during the regular class time from 7 p.m. in Building 10, room 1.

The class sessions are dovetailed with special showings of four of Cousteau's films culminating with a special presentation by Bill McDonald, underwater film producer, at 8 p.m. in the TCC theater, April 28.

The College Council was convened at 3:00 p.m. on March 28, 1977. The Agenda was amended to include an item concerning "condition of campus lawns". The Minutes of February 14, 1977, were approved. Out of courtesy to guests present, Item VI, Progress Report on Reorganization of Student Government, was moved to the first item of business.

After lengthy discussion, the reorganization committee (Diana Hibbs, Wendy Pennell, Dick Wright, Irish McKinney and faculty consultant, Charles B. Summers) agreed to return at a later date with their recommendations for reorganization of student government.

Dean Donald Gangnes reported on progress of refining the College Operating Budget for 1976-77 due to budget revisions based upon changes in the revenue picture. He also discussed status of the 1977-78 budget development. Questions concerning (1) capital improvement projects; (2) capital equipment budget; (3) auxiliary services budgets, as well as the College Operating Budget, were addressed by Mr. Gangnes.

The chairman introduced for consideration by the Council the policy for amending Board of Trustees policy. Wendy Pennell moved to accept for review and study the proposed policy statement. Donald Gangnes seconded the motion. The motion was passed unanimously.

The status of the Long Range Planning Commission's work was reviewed. The Chairman reported that the project is on schedule.

Dr. Stevens reviewed the impact of the recent "advertisement" in the Collegiate Challenge and pointed out the extent to which the item had reflected on the College. Council members expressed concern for any activity which would reflect adversely on the College. Student representatives on the Council expressed concerns which had come to their attention because of the advertisement.

Council members receiving the State Board for Community College Education's Legislative News were urged to follow progress of legislation affecting the community college system.

Council member Wendy Pennell inquired as to the reason for "sanding" lawn areas. Carl Brown, Dean of Administrative Services, explained that the use or organic fertilizer and the result of thatching required the thin coat of sand.

There being no further items brought before the Council, the meeting was adjourned at 4:45 p.m.

He will be demonstrating techniques of print-making during the morning hours in the basement exhibit "A Touch of Art."



NORWEGIAN SEMINAR

ISACD's 4th ANNUAL

European Seminar

"SCHOOL MORE THAN SCHOOL" is the theme of our 4th Annual IASCD European Seminar. This carefully arranged exposure to Norwegian and Scandinavian education is made possible by an "all air" tour that includes Copenhagen, Stavanger, and Oslo. At Stavanger the doors are open to the area schools, and educators in the schools and regional college have scheduled their annual EDUCATION FAIR to coincide with our visit. At Oslo the Royal Ministry of Education will arrange similar meetings, and our theme is expanded to be a "Window to Scandinavian Education." A planned panoramic tour of Copenhagen between flights. Educational assistance is provided by the Stavanger School Administration, Rogaland Regional College, the Royal Ministry in Oslo and the University of Oslo.

THE COST is \$695 and 15% for tips, taxes, and service. This includes jet transportation from Chicago to Copenhagen, connecting flight to Stavanger, thence to Oslo, and return via Copenhagen to Chicago. Accommodations will be in first class hotels throughout. Breakfast and several additional meals are provided. The trip includes all local arrangements for school visits, meetings, and other activities.

OPTIONAL EXCURSIONS will include visits in and around Stavanger and the fjord country; in Oslo comprehensive sightseeing, folklore evening, boar trips, Kon-Tiki raft, viking ships, etc.

SEMINAR FEE is \$40.00. This includes seminar materials, meeting room rentals, transportation to selected centers, honoria for noted European educators, etc. Only educators will be assessed and will be billed separately.
