Ever upward . . .

TCC's enrollment figures continue to set new records. The total number of persons who registered for spring quarter credit classes was 3,544 -- compared to 3,088 for the same quarter a year ago. The decline from winter quarter's total of 3,624 was less than usual. In addition, 1,061 persons are taking non-credit community service classes this spring. Records Officer Joe Kosai told the TCC Trustees at their April 22 meeting that applications for next fall are running 2 per cent ahead of last year.
