BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

Flowers and thanks were the order of the day at Thursday afternoon's regular meeting of the TCC Board of Trustees.

ASB president Irish McKinney presented new Board members Mildred Jeynes

and Sally Starke with corsages and best wishes from the student body.

Chairperson Ellen Pinto made a special presentation to former Board member Lewis Hatfield of a certificate which in part thanked Mr. Hatfield for his years of service on the TCC Board during the college's "time of birth, its time of growth and its time of hope."

Joe Betz, TCC math instructor who spent the last quarter in Arizona participating in a teacher exchange, said he was glad to be home and that he highly

recommends the experience of exchange teaching.

Correspondence shared with the Board included a letter to Lorraine Stephan, associate dean for occupational education, thanking her for her work with the State Real Estate Workshops; and a letter from George Huffman, TCCFT president, announcing the election of the union officers for the coming term.

New TCCFT officers will be Jerry McCourt, president; Joan Morris, vicepresident; Dick Lewis, secretary; and George Huffman, treasurer.

delegates will be Pam Huddleston, Frank Weihs and George Huffman.

Dr. Robert Rhule, dean of instruction, told the Board that \$5,729 has been awarded in federal funds for nursing student scholarships and that in September all 1976 TCC medical records technician graduates passed the national accreditation examination, scoring higher than the national mean.

Funding for a real estate workshop, a skills and survival workshop, administration of justice curriculum and the McNeil business program has been arranged,

he reported.

Carl Brown presented the administrative services report to the Board and included the information that the Schoenfeld-Gardner Foundation has presented to the college \$250 for the continuation of the minority affairs office book loan program. This is the third Schoenfeld-Gardner Foundation grant awarded to the college. He also said that the African-American Cultural Center has been relocated to 2502 Tacoma Avenue. Ron Wilson, administrator of the center, said he would keep the Board informed about activities at the new center.

Dean Brown also announced that the CETA program has been set with an expiration date of March 31, 1977, but possible funding of CETA employees might ex-

tend through July 15, 1977.

At the close of the meeting Betty Knauf, Phi Theta Kappa, TCC scholastic honorary, presented the Board with two new flags which had been purchased with proceeds of the Phi Theta Kappa bake sale.

The two new Board members were formally welcomed by Ellen Pinto, and a letter was read from former Board member Richard Evans. The letter commended the TCC community for its "concern for others" and extended his best wishes.

Next regular meeting of the Board was set for February 24 at 2 p.m. in

the Binns Room.
