A Lull -- Then Registration

The TCC campus, now enjoying a brief breathing spell, will step up its tempo in mid-September when orientation of new students and registration for the fall quarter begins. Tours of the campus for new students, their parents and the public are scheduled for Sunday afternoon, Sept. 12. The process of registering some 2,800 students for credit classes will begin Sept. 13 and continue through Sept. 23. Students who have applied for admission have been mailed appointments... Registration for non-credit community service classes will be held in the Wanamaker Instructional Resource Center from 6 to 8 p.m. Sept. 27-30. On-campus credit classes begin Sept. 27.

Classes a la Carte

TCC will serve up a menu of 47 non-credit community service classes this fall to suit nearly all tastes. A sampling: judo, beginning French, creative stitchery, mushroom identification, sail boat handling, art potpourri, speed reading, classical ballet. Most classes meet one night a week for eight weeks and cost \$15. They begin the week of Oct. 4.

TCC Receives Grant

TCC has been awarded a federal grant of \$84,000 for a one-year demonstration project for providing educational services in low-income housing communities. Gerald A. Vaughan of the TCC staff will be project director. TCC Trustees have authorized the appointment of three persons to work in the cooperative effort by TCC, Conifer Developments, Inc., and Model Cities. They are Mrs. Carlane Joyce Oilee and Tommy Lee Hilyard, assistants for instruction and development, and Nolan Lee Osher, assistant for research and evaluation. The project is aimed at serving some 1,400 persons with adult basic education, ethnic education, pre- and post-retirement education and family education.

Evening Hours

For the convenience of working people, TCC's new high school completion program will have evening office hours Monday through Thursday. The adult education office in Building 7 will be open from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. Monday through Thursday and from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Fridays. Classes in the high school completion program, to be offered for the first time this year on the TCC campus, will begin Sept. 20. The program is open to adults 18 and older. The fee is \$10 per quarter. Appointments for individual evaluations may be made by telephoning Robert C. Thornburg, the coordinator, at LO 4-7200.
