FACULTY INVITED TO BRING  
CLASSES TO ARTMOBILE ON CAMPUS

MARCH 9, 10

The faculty, staff and students of TCC are invited to tour the Washington State Artmobile which will be parked by the Building Three Theater March 9 and 10.

The artmobile will be at TCC and open from 5 p.m. to 10 p.m. March 9, and from 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. March 10.

Title of the exhibit is "The Many Faces of Art" and features a wide range of media including three-dimensional and textured pieces.

The vehicle, which is 70 feet long and 9 and a half feet wide, is operated and maintained by the Educational Service District No. 121 as part of the state's Cultural Enrichment program.

Terrance Valdez, art educator, drives the artmobile as well as answering questions.

Slides depicting many of the artists at work in their own setting are part of his presentation.

The artmobile usually serves schools, and school children from elementary schools around TCC have been scheduled to visit the exhibit.

The meeting was called to order at 2:50 p.m., in the John Binns Room, by Chairman Robert Rhule. There was no old business.

New Business

1. Pilot and Experimental Course Adoption -- English 198 - Drama: A Brief Study in Shakespeare (3 cr/3 lec/0 lab) Distribution: Humanities; To be offered Spring Quarter  
Lloyd Berntson explained the proposed course as one requested by the Associated Students and Program Board of Tacoma Community College. This will combine the National Shakespeare Company Shakespearean Workshop and two productions which will be offered on March 19, with two plays offered at the University of Puget Sound. It was noted that the course can be used for professional improvement credit toward longevity for TCC faculty. Faculty wishing longevity credit should send a written request to the Dean of Instruction so that it may be reflected in their personnel file. Ron Magden noted that some District #10 teachers are planning to take it for professional improvement.

MOTION: It was moved by Paul Michaels and seconded by Lynne Sloan that English 198 be adopted into the curriculum on an experimental basis.  
The motion passed unanimously.

2. Course Modification: History 280 - Title Change: FROM: America and the Cold War to Recent American History: 1945 to Present  
Dr. Ronald Magden explained that the new title describes better the emphasis given to domestic affairs in post World War II, U.S., as well as to U.S. foreign affairs.
3. Course Modification: History G100B (91) - Title & Description Change - FROM: U. S. Civilization to U. S. Civilization: Colonization to 1865
4. New Course Adoption: History 92 - U. S. Civilization: 1865 to Present (5 cr/5 lec/0 lab) Associate Degree Distribution: ALA; ATA; High School Diploma  
Dr. Ronald Magden explained that History 91 and 92 will be used to satisfy the State Superintendent of Public Instruction's requirement on equivalency time for high school credit. He said that the two-quarter U. S. history sequence will satisfy the SPI position on equivalency.
5. Course Modification: Engineering 100 - Engineering Orientation - FROM: 1 cr/1 lec/0 lab to 1 cr/2 lecture/discussion/0 lab
6. Course Modification: Engineering 180 - Engineering Mechanics Statics (4 cr/4 lec/0 lab) to: 4 cr/3 lecture + 2 Problem/Discussion
7. Course Modification: Engineering 230 - Engineering Mechanics: Dynamics FROM: 1 cr/1 lec/0 lab to 4 cr/3 lecture + Problem/Discussion
8. Course Modification: Engineering 260 - Thermodynamics (4 cr/4 lec/0 lab) TO: 4 cr/3 lecture + 2 Problem/Discussion



Dr. Jack Hyde and Ken Gentili (instructor) explained that the above adjustments are necessary as more time is needed for both lecture and problem/discussion. He said that Mr. Gentili had checked with the University of Washington for similarity. Mr. Gentili noted that the average age of the students in the engineering computer class was 23, which is below the norm for the other classes on campus. Mr. Gentili was commended on the quality of the engineering program on campus.

9. Course Modification: French 100 - Special Problems - Number Change. FROM: French 100 to French 199  
Dr. John Tuttle said the number change would more accurately reflect the variable nature of the course content and eliminate confusion with introductory survey courses for both students and advisors. It is a special problems course.
10. Course Deletion: Spanish 299C - Golden Age of Drama -- Deletion of this course was requested since there is no demand for it.
11. Course Modification: Music 100/200 - Choral Singing - From: 1 cr/0 lec/3 lab TO: Dave Whisner explained that this is a request to increase class time as well as credits.
12. Course Modification: Music 170/270 - Ensembles - Number Change: FROM: Music 170/270 to Music 199  
Dave Whisner explained that the request is to help more accurately reflect the variable course content and to make the 170/270 number available for a more appropriate course.

#### Other

1. Music Program -- Dave Whisner invited the Committee to attend the Music Department's program on March 9. Dr. Rhule said he would like to see more faculty attend TCC events, especially where students are involved. Students need recognition for the special effort they make.
2. Artmobile -- Paul Michaels announced that a 70-foot Artmobile will be next to the Little Theatre from 5-10 p.m., on March 9, and 8 a.m.-2:30 p.m., on March 10. He urged everyone to visit it since he has been trying to get it on campus for five years.
3. Registration -- Al Clarke reported that registration is going well, with 185 appointments a day for 20 days (February 28-March 18). He said that 700 more appointments can be achieved with this process. The first class openings list should be available on Tuesday, March 8, after 11 a.m.
4. Course Distribution Assignment - Women's Studies Courses -- Ron Magden explained that upon checking it was found that Women's Studies 101, 102, and 151 were previously passed by Instructional Council with a Social Science distribution and would be entered in the catalog distribution list.
5. Survey of Information About Developmental Studies Courses/LAC Committee -- Doreen Amoroso asked the divisions and departments to assist Carole Steadman in the development of a survey of a methodology to be used in the preparation of developmental courses. Information generated can be attached to each developmental course when they are presented to the Curriculum Committee. Dr. Rhule explained it was necessary to have back-up information for course coding in case of an audit.
6. Deadlines - Summer/Annual Schedule -- Dr. Rhule said that the summer schedule should be available during finals week or at the beginning of spring vacation. The annual schedule should be available shortly thereafter.
7. Research Report on Classic Theatre -- Dr. Rhule summarized several pertinent items in the report on the Classic Theatre evaluation. A copy of the report is on file in the Dean of Instruction's office.
8. Use of A-V Equipment and Courses -- Since Nick Huddleston was absent, this item will be held over until the next meeting of the Curriculum Committee

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 4:10 p.m. The next meeting of the Curriculum Committee will be held on Wednesday, March 16, at 2:45 p.m., in the John Binns Room of the Resource Center.
