"A VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE" OPENS

THURSDAY EVENING

Arthur Miller's "A View from the Bridge" is TCC's drama department presentation February 24, 25 and 26.

The play starts at 8 p.m. in the campus theater, Bldg. 3. TCC student David Sides plays the lead "Eddie," a longshoreman driven to committing an act of betrayal.

The modern classic tells the story of Eddie's entrapment in tragedy after a death-bed promise to raise an orphaned niece as his own daughter.

During the full-length play, author Miller used the classic Greek form, including a chorus who fills in the gaps of the narrative.

"A View from the Bridge" opened in Cape Cod, Mass., August 2, 1955. Some weeks later the play was presented on Broadway where it played for 17 weeks. It was subsequently performed in London and Chicago.

Minutes of Meeting January 24, 1977

The January 24, 1977, meeting of the College Council was convened by the Chairman at 3:00 p.m. in the John H. Binns Room of the College. The minutes of January 10, 1977, were approved as presented.

College Council Minutes - Page Two (January 24, 1977)

Dr. Stevens asked the Council if a vice-chairperson should be elected to oversee Council meetings in his absence. The group voted down the proposal.

Problems of sound transmission through classroom walls was discussed. Dr. Stevens explained that problems of sound transmission in buildings 15 and 18 were of an importance to faculty teaching in those classrooms affected. He outlined the relationship between the long term planning of improvements and current maintenance of existing facilities. He said that some form of interim repair would be attempted to solve the problem for now, but that the problem of sound would be looked at in relation to other needed improvements such as: heating and temperature control of classrooms, wind rattling sheet metal on building roofs, and thermostats in building 19.

Dean Brown reported that a part of the building 17 heat pump was on order and steps would be taken to inform faculty members located in building 17.

It was suggested by Vernon Hess that he thought it would be a good idea if reports from SBCCE could be placed in three-ring binders along with a copy of the College Policy Manual (and copies of the SBCCE Policy Manual) in the lounges of the faculty buildings. It was agreed that this might help toward solving the concern of disseminating materials of interest to the faculty and staff.

The Council reviewed the position description for the function of the Dean of Continuing Education and Community Services. Dr. Falk suggested modifications of the position description and these were agreed to by Council members and suggested to the President. Dr. Stevens indicated he would include the suggested changes in the document.

Next, the Council discussed the possibility of student/faculty/staff identification cards for 1977-78. Questions raised were: what type of card and what would be the cost factor? Also, does the college legally have to require identification cards?

After some discussion regarding the naming of campus buildings, the Council agreed to table the matter until a future meeting.

Dr. Stevens reviewed with the group the Minutes of the December WACC (Washington Association of Community College Presidents) meeting.

Council member Wendy Pennell presented a memorandum regarding the report from the ad hoc committee on campus appearance. The memo was not discussed and the Chairman referred it to Dean Brown for his action.

College requests for funding capital projects via the Economic Development Administration were reviewed by Dr. Stevens. He reported that the four projects submitted by the College were not approved. The projects are being held by Region X officials, however, in the event of additional funding at which time each project would be re-evaluated.

The next meeting of the College Council will be Monday, February 14, 1977.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:55 p.m.
