TCC Trustees did some worrying at their March 25 meeting about where the money is coming from to operate the college next year. Dr. Ford said that unless the State Senate increases the community college budget approved by the House of Representatives, TCC will be \$123,000 short of the funds it needs next year. Several Trustees speculated that the open door may have to be closed, that it may be necessary to turn away students.

New Program

TCC has launched a new program aimed at helping people choose careers and find jobs. It's called the Career Development Program. Mrs. Karen Becker, an experienced vocational counselor, is in charge of the federally funded, one-quarter program which helps students explore personal values, interests, and aptitudes; opportunities for careers and further training; and techniques of job-finding. The program also stresses development of job-related skills.

Learning Without Red Tape

Forty-nine non-credit community service courses on a wide variety of subjects will be offered at TCC during the spring quarter, beginning the week of April 12. Most classes meet from 7 to 9:30 one night a week for eight weeks. A brochure listing the courses has been mailed to most Tacoma homes. Registration may be made in advance with the TCC Community Services Office or at the first class session.
