

WHAT HAPPENED TO SEPTEMBER?

Where did September go? At TCC it was a hectic whirl of registration for the fall quarter, the beginning of fall quarter classes, and a start toward MBO. What is MBO? It stands for "management by objective." Simply stated, it is a technique of focusing efforts on the job to be accomplished. Faculty and staff spent Sept. 17 in a day-long orientation session on MBO, conducted by Marshall Van Ostrom, management consultant. And they devoted Sept. 24 to a work-shop on applying MBO to their own jobs.

REGISTRATION: UPS AND DOWNS

Final registration figures aren't complete, but it appears that enrollment in TCC's credit classes is up just slightly over last fall -- 3,171 full-time equivalents compared to 3,151 a year ago. However, the totals will fall below TCC's target for this year, mainly because the 1971 Legislature decided that community service courses are not eligible for state support. This particularly hurts TCC, which has one of the largest community service programs.
