Booth Gardner and Tacoma Mayor Gordon Johnston took part in the ceremonies marking completion of the \$497,000 expansion and remodeling. Snow in the morning and rain driven by 40-m.p.h. winds in the evening kept attendance down, leading one science faculty member to quip: "We didn't have a dedication; we had a baptism." Even so, about 40 persons turned out to hear Jack H. Hyde, TCC geology instructor, lecture on Mount St. Helens and other Washington volcanos.
