RICHARD G. GRAY, Ph.D.

Richard G. Gray, national director of Project Public Information, has acquired extensive experience in the worlds of education and communication. He began his journalistic career as editor of the award-winning *Lincoln News* in his home city of Tacoma. Later he became news editor of the *Tacoma Star*. In 1959 he joined the *St. Louis Post-Dispatch*, gaining experience in the Pulitzer tradition as a reporter, rewrite man, and feature writer. He has also worked as a freelance writer and as a correspondent for *Time, Inc.*

In 1954 Gray was graduated from Whitworth College, Spokane, with a B.A. in education. Later he earned his M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Minnesota in political science and journalism. While in school he was honored as a Danforth Fellow and a Lincoln Scholar. Besides gaining experience in the elementary and secondary school levels in Spokane, Dr. Gray has taught at the University of Minnesota and Northwestern University. At present he is on leave from Northwestern, where he is an associate professor and a member of the graduate school faculty. Project Public Information, which he currently heads, is a federally financed three-year effort to improve public information services and programs in state departments of education.

Tacoma Community College is a publicly owned, publicly supported college which provides two years of collegiate study for the people of the Tacoma-Pierce County area.

The college, now in its third year, served a total enrollment

of 2,697 during the fall quarter of 1967.
